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1 Opening and welcome

After a short introduction and welcome by Marleen Goumans for the University of applied science (<https://www.rotterdamuas.com/research/research-centres/innovations-in-care/>) and Annejet Lieshout for the municipality of Rotterdam the Triade programme starts.

2 Recommendations

Johan welcomes and thanks everybody for the continuing enthusiasm and efforts done since the 2nd meeting in Belgium

Johan gives a state of affairs about the recommendations (desired output). He has summarized all ideas and suggestions gathered by everyone and processed by the Swedish partners (template 4) into four themes (a 5th was added during the discussion – and more can be added during the project). The work in progress reveals that we need to change the way to classify the recommendations; one main reason is the overlap between the different relevant and significant ideas : instead of listing up recommendations according to education and policy, we will classify/order the ideas according to 4 (5 or more) themes; each theme containing the most relevant elements of the theme (definition, relevance,...), the recommendations (independent policy or education or...), description of most important good practices shared during the meetings (with b.o. the critical factors of success). We decided that each theme will have 'an owner' who will elaborate, add elements coming from upcoming meetings, and will present during the final meeting.

At this point of the project – already taking into account the theme of the Rotterdam meeting - the selected themes are:

1. The 'new = inclusive' professional.
→ **IVAS and Irecoop** are both the owner of 1st theme.
2. The organization development, this is a new theme that is added during the meeting. (to be elaborated and attributed to an owner)
3. Valorisation of ageing people and of working with the ageing
This has a general/social element (ageing people are full citizens and contribute to society; how does society deal with 'ageing'; what does



'inclusion' mean?...) and an educational component (how can the study of geriatrics be valorised etc.

Also politics should pay attention to this subject. What is the right way to do it. How could this be changed. Participation in society is a way, not only sensibilization. The key is to focus on shared interest.

→ **Val de Marne is owner of this theme.**

4. Informal care

→ **Rotterdam is the owner of this theme.**

5. Quality of life as the main frame of reference; there is a strong need for a shared, clearly defined frame of reference / model QOL, with all kind of applications (policy, reference, subvention, HR, education, (universal/European?) indicators .

→ **The Flemish organisations (HoGent, Sint Vincentius, Achtkanter are the owners of this subject.**

(to be discussed : maybe new teams will be defined, but all partners will be the owner or co-owner of one theme).

(Johan will make a template for description of the themes by September)

3 **Template 4**

Consequences for the TRIADE methodology

Template 4 will not be used anymore as it is developed now. Johan, Sweden and Rotterdam, will work on a new template, and then they send it around to the partners so that they know what is expected of them.

Sweden will not make a summary, but will collect and 'copy paste'. All partners, based on the input of the Local Expert Group, will put the information in the new Template, put it on dropbox and send it to the Swedish partners – they will make one final template 4 as soon as everyone has sent their input. This information is the basis for the 'owners' of the 'themes' to complete and elaborate their theme.

Each owner, during each upcoming meeting, will present the actual situation of the 'theme'.
